Tamar Beraia was born in Tbilisi, Georgia, in the family of musicians. At the age of 5, she received her first piano lessons from her mother and began her formal piano training at the Tbilisi Musical Gymnasium with Dodo Tsintsadze. Since very early childhood, she has performed in piano duet with her sister Natia Beraia. In 2003, she enrolled in the piano studio of Nana Khubutia at the Tbilisi Sarajishvili State Conservatoire to earn Bachelor's degree in piano performance. Ms. Beraia's awards include: Third Tbilisi International Piano Competition, First prize and three special prizes, including the Eteri Andjaparidze Special Award; N.Gabunia National Piano Competition, (Tbilisi, Georgia), First prize; Liza Leonskaia scholarship; the President of Georgia scholarship; "New Names" (Moscow, Russia), diploma in the chamber music category "Piano Duet", first scholarship of the M.Tariverdiev foundation, diploma for "Artistic Individuality"; the Governor's International Piano Competition (Saratov, Russia). First prize; International Television Festival "Bravo Bravissimo" (Cremona, Italy); International Piano Duet Competition (Saint-Petersburg, Russia): First prize and three special diplomas; B.Dvarionas international competition (Vilnius, Lithuania): special prize for the best

performance of a contemporary work. Ms. Beraia has appeared with the Berlin Symphony Orchestra conducted by Vachtang Machavariani in Frankfurt and Potsdam, Germany, and in a duo piano recital with her sister Natia Beraia at the Max-Joseph Hall in Munich, Germany. Since 2002, Tamar Beraia has been a member of the Michel Sogny Foundation "SOS TALANTS", and performed in its concert series and festivals in Serbia, Austria, France, and Switzerland. Tamar Beraia is appearing on the AmerKlavier series at DePaul University School of Music and other venues in Chicago as a recipient of the Eteri Andjaparidze Special Award.
